

Bake Sale for City Mission



During the Easter holidays 2 pupils – Kyle Gault and Blair McGregor (S5) and a former pupil – Kyle Hannin represented Scotland in the Learning Disability Home Nations Tournament in Kilwinning. The boys got off to a great

start beating Northern Ireland 3-0, despite being reduced to 10 men. In their next game they game from behind to draw 2-2 with Wales which set up a thrilling final game against the Republic of Ireland where victory would see them crowned champions again. They again, fell behind to an early goal, however, showed great determination to fight back and win the match 2-1, this meant they had retained



their title as **Home Nations** Champions. A number of parents, staff and pupils (both past and present) travelled to Kilwinning to support the boys and they were very grateful for this. We are very proud of their

achievements. A final congratulations must go to Mr Baird who is one of the coaches of the team. He too was thrilled by their success.
