

#### School Lunches

School lunches are available in school at a cost of £1.90 per day or £9.50 per week. If you are entitled to receive free school meals please ensure your applications are up-to-date. If you need to check this please contact the school office. All young people are asked to eat their packed lunch in the dinner school with the other pupils so that they can develop their social skills and peer relationships. Abercorn continues to be a health promoting school and we work with young people to make healthy choices, therefore I would ask you to think about the items that you give to your son/daughter for their snack/packed lunch to see if there are healthier alternatives. Glasgow City Council have now removed flavoured milk from the dinner school to assist in reducing a young person's sugar intake.

#### School Uniform

It has been lovely to see all of our young people returning to school in their school uniform. Many of our pupils are looking smart in their school blazers which are now part of our uniform. School Blazers can be bought from a number of shops including Asda, Tesco and Matalan.
