1056 if a pupil is not going to be on their taxi run. This is a freephone number available 24 hours a day. The school should also then be

informed of any pupil absence.

We must also be made aware if a pupil has not travelled in the morning taxi but **does** require to be added to the run for the home time journey. If pupils have not travelled in to school by taxi that morning drivers **will not** take them home without prior notice.

Please note also that the wait time for taxis is only **5 minutes**. Pupils should be ready and waiting for their taxi to arrive as drivers are unable to wait outside the house for longer than 5 minutes.

If your child is not going to require the taxi it is important you contact Transport to let them know to cancel the taxi for that run. There are costs incurred when taxis arrive when not needed.
