Whilst working on this they decided to engage with the Glasgow City Council Road Safety team to ensure they were taking account of staying safe while making their journeys. The work they did with this team was shortlisted for the Lord Provost Road Safety Award and we are delighted to say that we won!

Scottish Education Awards

We are delighted to announce that we were successful at the recent Scottish Education Award ceremony in winning the Gaelic Education Award. After our submission was shortlisted we were visited by judges who spoke to staff, parents and voung people about their experiences of Gaelic Education within Abercorn. Thank you also to Donald MacLeod from Care for a Ceilidh and Joan Nicholson from Glasgow Life and Glasgow Mid Argyle Shinty who also came along to speak on our behalf. As part of the award we were given £400 by the sponsors and Mrs Collie has been to the Gaelic bookshop already to spend this on resources to continue the good work.
