

Dear Parent/Carer

This has once again been a very busy term for all of the staff and pupils in Abercorn and everyone is looking forward to their Spring Break. In particular, our senior pupils have been busy preparing for their internal assessments and SQA examinations which they will complete over the next few months. I am sure you will join me in wishing them every success

As you will read from this newsletter it has been another extremely busy month here in Abercorn. The young people have had the opportunity to extend their learning experiences both within and outwith our school and these will continue next term. An integral part of these learning experiences is the large number of residential trips that we organise for our young people to participate in. A group of 24 fifth and sixth year pupils and 4 staff are currently away in Blairvadach. Next term we will see trips within Scotland to Aviemore, Isle of Skye, a Duke of Edinburgh expedition and our annual international trip to Spain.

One of the current initiatives by the Scottish Government is the 1+2 Languages programme. This is where young people speak in their first language ie English and then experience two others. Within Abercorn young people have been learning Spanish for a number of years, we recently introduced Gaelic to our curriculum and this has proven to be very popular. I am also very pleased to announce that we have been awarded the Glasgow **Gaelic Language Learner Award 2016**. Mrs Collie, Miss Hunter and a number of our pupils attended the awards ceremony on Thursday, 25 March to collect our certificate – well done to everyone for all of their hard work!!! In addition, one of our second year pupils, Rabia Safia received the **Language Learner of the Year Award** – congratulations Rabia.

The weather has been very wet for most of the winter it has been dryer in recent weeks and we hope that this continues. We are encouraging the young people to go outside during break times, this is usually for 15 minutes in the morning and approx. 15 minutes at lunchtime. We know that the weather is very changeable at present and I would like to ask you to remind your son/daughter to bring their outdoor jackets with them and to put them on during break times.

I would once again like to thank you all for your continued support and your attendance at all of the events organised by the school. Thank you to all parents/carers who attended annual review meetings this term and we had a turnout of 51% at our recent parents' evening and an overall attendance of 65% for the session.

We have received information regarding our S1 intake for August 2016 and it is currently significantly larger than last year. Timetabling for next session will begin in earnest at the start of the new term. Over the next couple of months we will provide you with as much information regarding curricular choices and individual opportunities for you to discuss these options will be made available.

I hope that you all had a very pleasant Easter weekend and the spring break will give everyone the opportunity to recharge their batteries and come back refreshed for the new term.

For some of our pupils this has a greater effect than others and, as each child is different, the signs manifest themselves in different ways.

We are working with each individual pupil to support them in the best possible way and will continue to do so throughout the next few weeks as well as during the exams and we would encourage any parent who feels their child is concerned about the exams or suffering stress to let us know.

We have advised all pupils preparing for the exams of the importance of completing work at home to ensure they are best prepared, however, we have also made clear that it is important to relieve stress to have some time out from the constant pressure and have spoken to them about some relaxing activities they may consider when taking a break from studying.
