### **Camas Trip 2016**

Miss Campbell and Mr Robertson recently left Queen Street Station accompanied by 10 pupils for a 6 day visit to Camas Outdoor Centre. Camas is situated on a very isolated part of the Island of Mull. There is little electricity, no TV, no computers, and no shops or houses for miles in any direction. That said however, the pupils had a fantastic time abseiling, canoeing, hill walking, peat-digging, swimming and a host of indoor activities.

This was a great opportunity for pupils to develop deeper friendships with one another, and they were excellent at helping each other through the day's activities. All of the pupils enjoyed the experience and discovered what it was like to live together as a community.

**0800 032 4444** if a pupil is not going to be on the morning taxi run. This is a free-phone number available 24 hours a day. The school should also then be informed of any pupil absence. This number can also be used to enquire about taxi's which may not have turned up on time report any issues.

We must also be made aware if a pupil has not travelled in the morning taxi but does require to be added to the run for the home-time journey. If pupils have not travelled in to school by taxi that morning drivers will not take them home without prior notice.

Please note also that the wait time for taxis is now only 5 minutes. Pupils should be ready and waiting for their taxi to arrive as drivers are unable to



wait outside the house for longer than 5 minutes.

If for any reason you require your son/daughter's pick up/drop off address to be changed then we require a minimum of 5 days' notice.

#### **Auschwitz**

On Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> October Sean
Hughes and William Mitten will
travel with Mr Baird for a one day
trip to Auschwitz. Run in
conjunction with the Holocaust
Education Trust this unique experience allows the
pupils to develop a deeper understanding of what
people suffered during the holocaust. The
project, titled Lessons from Auschwitz sees pupils
undertake 2 afternoon seminars and a one day
visit to the former Nazi extermination camp
Auschwitz-Birkenau in order to pass on the
lessons to their schools and communities. On
their return the boys will work on ways to
disseminate the information they have gathered
