
## S1 Outings

## **Determined to Make Movies**

Abercorn were recently invited to submit a proposal to take part in a film making programme and competition called Determined to Make Movies. For the 2012 project Education Services have embraced the Games Legacy for Glasgow theme associated with the Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games and were invited schools to make movies inspired by the theme 'the Commonwealth' and in particular to make movies that showcased or linked in some way to their partner Commonwealth country. As you may be aware, Archbishop Conti has, in past years, celebrated Mass for Catholic children who attend S.E.N. schools and units. #### **Healthy Breakfast**

Pupils in our Maths and PE departments recently carried out a survey of all pupils to find out who has breakfast before they come to school in the morning. This survey was undertaken as part of a unit of work where they are looking at the effects of eating a healthy breakfast on the ability to learn effectively. They did, however, discover that 1/3 of pupils in the school do not eat anything before they leave the house in the morning. Since they now know that this can lead to pupils feeling tired, hungry and lacking in concentration they would like to point out the importance of eating a healthy breakfast. They are currently compiling what they have learned into the form of a leaflet promoting the benefits of starting the day in a positive way.



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
