We have now come to the end of an extremely busy month here in Abercorn. I would like to take this opportunity to welcome our S1 pupils and their families to our school community. The S1 pupils are looking smart in their new school uniforms and are settling into the routines of secondary school life.

The exam results this year were once again outstanding and I would like to thank both pupils and staff for their hardwork. Many young people also achieved success in a range of wider achievements such as The Duke of Edinburgh Award, John Muir Award and a range of sporting, art and enterprise activities. We are extremely proud of our young people and delighted that they continue to achieve such high standards.

Transport Co-ordination Centre Freephone Number

Please call the Transport Co-ordination Centre on **0800 032 4444** if a pupil is not going to be on the morning taxi run. This is a freephone number available 24 hours a day. The school should also then be informed of any pupil absence.

We must also be made aware if a pupil has not travelled in the morning taxi but does require to be added to the run for the hometime journey. If pupils have not travelled in to school by taxi that morning drivers will not take them home without prior notice.

Please note also that the wait time for taxis is now only 5 minutes. Pupils should be ready and waiting for their taxi to arrive as drivers are unable to wait outside the house for longer than 5 minutes.
