Changes to the School Day



By now you will all have received a letter regarding the changes to the school day imposed by Glasgow City Council. As of August the school day in Abercorn will start at 8.55am and finish at 3.25pm Monday to Thursday and 3pm on a Friday.

Pupils will get 40 minutes for lunch. This was a necessary change in order to ensure our pupils received the same educational entitlement as pupils in mainstream secondaries.

Jewellery

We have been asked to make all parents aware of the information contained within the guidance note which accompanies this newsletter. It is Glasgow City Council policy to ask pupils to remove any pierced items when taking part in PE, Games, Sports or swimming. Our staff insist on this and provide a safe place for pupils to put such items whilst taking part in any activities. However, we would recommend that pupils do not wear a lot of jewellery in general.

Bearing this guidance in mind I'd like to take this opportunity to say that if you are considering getting your child's ears pierced then my advice would be to do it at the start of the holidays so that they will be able to remove the pierced items for PE when they return to school in August without interfering with the healing process.

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
