Double Award Winning School

The School were given the Commonwealth Country of Vanuatu in the South Pacific to research and create a five minute film under the theme of The Commonwealth. Social Enterprise Awards Ceremony

S3 pupils in Abercorn have been operating a successful parent's cafe in recent months and due to the fact that they do not keep their profits but donate them to charity they have been awarded a **Social Enterprise in Schools Award**.

When the Business class joined forces with the Home Economics class running a cafe seemed an obvious choice, however, less obvious was the decision to use their profit from this venture to help those less fortunate than themselves. Abercorn's Student Council have been actively fundraising to support children in Malawi and the cafe group felt this was such a worthwhile cause they offered them the profits from their monthly cafe's to help boost their total. This gesture turned their enterprise from a money making scheme into a Social Enterprise. When Jay Lamb from the Social Enterprise Academy visited the group in February he was so impressed with their idea and commitment he put them forward to receive a Social Enterprise in Schools Award.



Four members of the cafe group travelled to Edinburgh on Tuesday 19th June to attend the Social Enterprise Academy's Awards Ceremony and to receive the

award on behalf of the whole group. They were delighted to learn that John Swinney, Cabinet Secretary for Finance and Sustainable Growth, was there to present the awards and listened intently as he explained that he and his government colleagues will continue to support Social Enterprise in the future.

The group plan to continue running cafes in the new session as a joint venture between Business and Home Economics and they are very grateful to Mrs Johnston (HE) for all her support in making the cafe a success each month.

Abercorn's Apprentice

All S2 Enterprise classes recently participated in the final of Abercorn's annual Apprentice competition. There were 5 teams working on the project this year and their task was to create a food product to be sold to spectators during the London 2012 Olympic Games. On Wednesday 13th June they had to present their ideas to a panel of judges made up of local business partners.

The pupils loved the theme of this year's project and got very excited whilst researching the Olympics and the sports which would be involved. They came up with a variety of interesting products including pick 'n' mix pies, biscuits, flapjacks, family sized fruit salad to share and the winning burgers. This group of pupils decided to theme their burgers around the Olympic medals and had bronze (plain), silver (spicy) and gold (flaming hot) burgers.

All groups spent time working on this interdisciplinary learning project in Enterprise where they developed their business ideas, Home Economics where they created their products and Art & Design where they designed logo's and packaging for their products.

The judges were very impressed with the standard of every group and thought their work on the project was excellent, however, they felt that *The Flaming Burger Company* had the full package with a fabulous idea, a great product and very well designed packaging. The Diana Award endeavors to appreciate and celebrate the work which young people make to their school, family or community - especially those who are peer mentors, fund raisers, school counselors, environmental campaigners, sports leaders, local community volunteers, and those who have overcome adversity. The vision is to promote a culture that celebrates young people from all sections of society who have made a selfless contribution to their community.
