


Abercorn News

Dear Parent/Carer

This has once again been a very busy term for all of the staff and pupils in Abercorn and everyone is looking forward to their Spring Break. In particular, our senior pupils have been busy preparing for their SQA examinations and internal assessments which they will complete over the next few months. I am sure you will join me in wishing them every success. At the end of this newsletter is a list of all of the examination dates. Individual letters will be sent home with individual pupils with information on their specific assessment arrangements and the start/finish times of their exams. If you have any SQA queries please do not hesitate to contact Miss Hunter at the school. The official school leaving date is 31 May 2015 although many young people choose to continue attending until the end of session.

As you will read from this newsletter it has been another extremely busy month here in Abercorn. The young people have had the opportunity to extend their learning experiences both within and outwith our school and these will continue next term. An integral part of these learning experiences is the large number of residential trips that we organise for our young people to participate in. A group of 27 third and fourth year pupils and 4 staff have just returned from another very successful trip to Alton Towers and Blackpool. Next term we will see trips to Aviemore, Stirling, Spain, Blairvadach and a Duke of Edinburgh expedition.

Our refurbishment programme is continuing and over the Spring Break there will be work done on "sound proofing" our classroom areas. Unfortunately the school swimming pool has not been in use this month and we are hoping to hear very soon that the pool will be operational again for the start of next term. This has meant that the heating has been on in school 24 hours per day, if the weather is mild outside then the school can be very warm in some areas. We are encouraging the young people to go outside during break times, this is usually for 15 minutes in the morning and approx. 15 minutes at lunchtime. We know that the weather is very changeable at present and I would like to ask you to remind your son/daughter to bring their outdoor jackets with them and to put them on at during break times.

I would once again like to thank you all for your continued support and your attendance at all of the events organised by the school. Thank you to all parents/carers who attended annual review meetings this term and we had a turnout of 47% at our recent parents' evening. As many of you know Mr Kerr has been absent for the last few weeks and we have not organised all of the S4 Review meetings as yet, these are in the process of being reorganised for the start of next term.

We have received information regarding our S1 intake for August 2015. It would appear that our first year will be much smaller than previous years. This will mean that next term we will plan for a much smaller school roll which will also mean that we anticipate there to be a number of staffing changes. Over the next couple of months we will provide you with as much information regarding curricular choices and individual opportunities for you to discuss these options will be made available.

May I wish you all a very happy Easter, this holiday will give everyone the opportunity to recharge their batteries and come back refreshed for the new term.

We are aware that a number of our senior pupil are beginning to feel the effects of the upcoming exams and are displaying signs of stress. For some of our pupils this has a greater effect than others and, as each child is different, the signs manifest themselves in different ways.

We are working with each individual pupil to support them in the best possible way and will continue to do so throughout the next few weeks as well as during the exams and we would encourage any parent who feels their child is concerned about the exams or suffering stress to let us know.

We have advised all pupils preparing for the exams of the importance of completing work at home to ensure they are best prepared, however, we have also made clear that it is important to relieve stress to have some time out from the constant pressure and have spoken to them about some relaxing activities they may consider when taking a break from studying.
