Scottish Education Awards Active Nation Award



Having been shortlisted as finalists for the Scottish education Awards Active Nation Award we were recently visited by Education Scotland for some more information on our entry. They spent a very enjoyable morning speaking to our pupils and staff as well as some of our partners who assist with our sporting activities. This category recognizes schools that have developed opportunities for all children and young people to be active on a regular basis with a wide participation in sports and other physical activities. The panel will now consider all of the available information to make their decision and, as finalists, we have been invited to attend the awards ceremony on Monday 10th June so fingers crossed.

Breakfast Club

We have recently had a breakfast club pilot running in our school by Miss Thomson and S5/6 Maths. The pupils have been putting their Maths and numeracy skills into action by running the breakfast club whilst at the same time encouraging pupils to have a healthy meal to set them up for the day.

Tenner Challenge

Both of our S3 Business classes have been participating in the Young Enterprise "Tenner challenge". Each class has been allocated £10 and their



task was to try and turn it into as much money as possible during the month of May. Group 1 chose to arrange a fun morning for S1-S3 pupils on Thursday 2nd May. They used their £10 to purchase refreshments to sell during activities and managed to raise £80. Group 2 decided to organize a cake stall; they used their £10 to purchase ingredients and baked a selection of cakes to sell to pupils on Wednesday 15th May. They were very grateful to receive donations of baking from Mrs McKenzie (grandmother of David Mott in S2) and decorating ingredients from Mrs Shiells (mum of Craig in S1) to boost their total. Their stall was very successful and they managed to raise £60 although they learned that with more stock they could easily have doubled that figure! Both groups must now repay their initial £10 loan from Young Enterprise. Since they have been learning about Social Enterprise they have decided their outstanding profits (£120) will be added to the parents' café profit going to Yorkhill. Well done to both classes.

Social Enterprise Café



We have been in contact with the charity '*Chloe's Chemoo Cows'* whose mission is to raise

awareness and much needed funds to brighten the lives of children with cancer, to do this they work alongside the play therapists at the Schiehallion Ward, Yorkhill Children's Hospital. One of the first things Chloe's Chemoo Cows does is provide all children receiving chemotherapy with their own Chemoo Cow gift box containing a soft toy cow, bookmark, sticker and certificate.

They then liaise with the staff to buy much needed activities, crafts, toys, DVDs and other items for the children or the ward. They deliver these huge parcels of crafts & activities to the ward 3 times a year as well as making additional deliveries with other gifts at special points in the year including Christmas and Easter. Having contacted them recently to say that the S3 Business class had been learning about Social Enterprise and running a monthly parents café with the help of Mrs Johnston and S3 Home Economics, we were delighted when they said we could work with them to spend our profit on some much needed portable DVD players. We have been to Richer Sounds in Jamaica Street and ordered 15 Toshiba portable DVD players which we will be delighted to hand over in the next few weeks.
