S1 Post Placement Reviews

Our S1 pupils seem to have settled well into the rules and routines within Abercorn. They have a good grasp of their timetables and have begun to participate in clubs etc. Staff will shortly be given the opportunity to feedback on their progress in classes and also give details of any issues that have arisen and this will form the basis of a post placement review meeting with Mr Robertson towards the end of October. Parents/carers will be advised of the time for this meeting nearer the time.

S6 Leavers Reviews

Our S6 pupils have also settled well into the courses and are working towards a variety of qualifications, awards and wider achievements. Parents will be invited to attend a leavers review with Mr Shields in November to discuss arrangements and possible destinations for post school transition. Parents/carers will be advised of the time for this meeting nearer the time.

School Meals

At the end of last session (June) we issued information regarding Free School Meal entitlement along with the necessary forms. If you think you may be



entitled to free school meals for this session, and you haven't already completed the forms, you must do so as soon as possible. Since the award of free school meals is means tested it is necessary to repeat this process at the start of every academic session. Any pupil who has not been awarded free school meals will be required to pay £1.40 per day if they wish to have a school meal. if a pupil is not going to be on the morning taxi run. This is a freephone number available 24



hours a day. The school should also then be informed of any pupil absence.

We must also be made aware if a pupil has not travelled in the morning taxi but does require to be added to the run for the hometime journey. If pupils have not travelled in to school by taxi that morning drivers will not take them home without prior notice.

Please note also that the wait time for taxis is now only 5 minutes. Pupils should be ready and waiting for their taxi to arrive as drivers are unable to wait outside the house for longer than 5 minutes.
