Health and Wellbeing Focus Weeks

hours a day. The school should also then be informed of any pupil absence. This number can also be used to enquire about taxi's which may not have turned up on time.

We must also be made aware if a pupil has not travelled in the morning taxi but does require to be added to the run for the hometime journey. If pupils have not travelled in to school by taxi that morning drivers will not take them home without prior notice.

Please note also that the wait time for taxis is now only 5 minutes. Pupils should be ready and waiting for their taxi to arrive as drivers are unable to wait outside the house for longer than 5 minutes.

Auschwitz

On Monday 7th October Garry Hamilton and Kyle Hannin (S6) will travel with Mr Connor for a one day trip to Auschwitz. Run in conjunction with the holocaust education trust this unique experience will allow the pupisl to develop a deeper understanding of what people suffered during the holocaust. The project, titled Lessons from Auschwitz sees pupils undertake 2 afternoon seminars and a one day visit to the former Nazi extermination camp Auschwitz-Birkenau in order to pass on the lessons to their schools and communities. On their return the boys will work on ways to disseminate the information they have gathered through the seminars and the trip.

This is an opportunity to speak to your child's teachers and find out more information about their work and behavior in class.
