Auschwitz

On Wednesday 28th October Tammyjoe McDonald and Dougal Fraser (S6) will travel with Mrs Whitelocke for a one day trip to Auschwitz. Run in conjunction with the Holocaust Education Trust this unique experience will allow the pupils to develop a deeper understanding of what people suffered during the holocaust. The project, titled *Lessons from Auschwitz* sees pupils undertake 2 afternoon seminars and a one day visit to the former Nazi extermination camp Auschwitz-Birkenau in order to pass on the lessons to their schools and communities. On their return the boys will work on ways to disseminate the information they have gathered through the seminars and the trip.

Scottish Studies Award

A number of pupils are working on a new Scottish Studies Award this term. All of S3 are undertaking the mandatory unit where they will broaden their knowledge about a particular aspect of Scotland. They can then go on to pick up additional units towards the overall award in subsequent years so we have a number of pupils in S4/5/6 who undertook their mandatory unit last year and will this year work to complete the required number of units to attain the award. The additional units involve them studying in other curricular areas but with a Scottish focus. Mrs Collie is very involved in the delivery of this award and, consequently, there are a number of pupils learning basic Gaelic.

Employment Skills

We have a number of pupils working on the new National 2 Employment Skills units from SOA in a variety of subject areas. These units give pupils the opportunity to investigate working in certain employment sectors and also the chance to experience working in that sector. For example, the Marketing and Events group are organizing the prom; the Catering and Customer Service group plan to organize a café and a lunch over the course of the year and the Office Administration group are learning about working in an office and in fact they produced and distributed the recent letter you received regarding the September weekend holiday. These units are an ideal way to introduce pupils to the employment opportunities available in different sectors.

Malawi



Mr Anderson of the RE department is currently in Malawi on a month long educational exchange programme called Malawi Leaders of Learning. He is working to broaden the literacy skills of the pupils in a school there. The pupils have the chance to follow his journey when they read his blog during Student Tutor time each morning. Newsround

presentation showing the effects of road traffic accidents and also from Glasgow City Council's Road Safety team. Successful completion of the Award will gain them the right to sit an abridged version of the theory test where they will be given a test with less questions than the standard version – this is proving to be very motivating for them!
