## Auschwitz

On Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> November Kyle Martin and Callum McLaughlin will travel with Mr Anderson for a one day trip to Auschwitz. Run in conjunction with the Holocaust Education Trust this unique experience allows the pupils to develop a deeper understanding of what people suffered during the holocaust. The project, titled *Lessons from Auschwitz* sees pupils undertake 2 afternoon seminars and a one day visit to the former Nazi extermination camp Auschwitz-Birkenau in order to pass on the lessons to their schools and communities. On their return the pupils will work on ways to disseminate the information they have gathered through the seminars and the trip.
